#### Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) Paper Style for Semester-end Examination

The Semester-end Examination for all courses would be of **60 Marks**. The common paper style for all courses for the distribution of these 60 Marks would be as follows:

- **12 Marks** for Translation and or Explanation type question.
- **12 Marks** for 3 definition-type, text/topic-based about 750-words answers; can also be asked from the background and allied / related terms, short narrative questions etc. (4 X 3 = 12)
- **12 Marks** for text or literary evaluation type questions about 750 words answers. (4 X 3 = 12)
- **12 Marks** for Critical appreciations or Evaluative type question (general question) regarding the author or Sanskrit works prescribed in the syllabus (12 x 1 = 12) The students can answer not more than 750 words.
- **12 Marks** for MCQs (from the topics / texts as well as the background) (12 x 1 = 12)
